Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial results of **VL E-Governance & IT Solutions Limited** (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025 ("the Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended ("the Listing Regulations").

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Notes to the Audited financial results for the Quarter and Year ended March 31, 2025:

- 1 The above Audited financial results for the Quarter and Year ended March 31, 2025, have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on May 26, 2025. The Company confirms that its statutory auditors have issued the audit report with unmodified opinion on the financial results for the Quarter and Year ended March 31, 2025.
- 2 These results have been prepared on the basis of standalone financial statements, which are prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind-AS) as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and notified by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (as amended).
- 3 *Exceptional Items for the period comprise a prudent provision made towards Expected Credit Losses (ECL) on the Company's financial assets, fully in line with the requirements of Ind AS 109 Financial Instruments. This reflects our forward-looking approach to risk management and commitment to transparent financial reporting.

The ECL provision has resulted in a reduction in net worth for the period. Notwithstanding this, the Company maintains a strong balance sheet, with positive net worth of Rs. 4,569.66 lakhs. The Company's core operations remain fully underway, delivering healthy operational revenues.

In accordance with Ind AS 1 – Presentation of Financial Statements, management has reviewed cash flow forecasts, working capital requirements, budgets and key performance indicators. Based on this comprehensive assessment, there are no material uncertainties that would materially affect the Company's ability to continue as a going concern or to pursue its business objectives in the foreseeable future.

The management is fully committed to closely pursuing the recovery from the underlying assets all the receipts from these assets will be earning accretive.

We have strong confidence in the quality of our assets and our credit-risk management system, which support our long-term financial strength and future growth.
